We are pleased to announce the recent formation of the **Committee to Address Anti-Asian Bias and Racism (CAABR).** We formed this committee in April of this year to address the growing concerns and fears about the racism experienced by our Asian and Asian American colleagues. Co-chaired by Amanda Rhee, MD, and James Tsai, MD, the committee is tasked with engaging stakeholders from across the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai and the Health System to develop and implement strategies to address anti-Asian bias and racism.

The Committee's work and focus on the Asian and Asian American community builds upon the recommendations in the Road Map for Action and aligns with the system-wide effort to address racism and bias led by the Office for Diversity and Inclusion. The primary objectives of the Committee focus on developing and implementing strategies to address anti-Asian bias and racism based on current needs and concerns, identified as:

- Broadcasting information in a centralized and accessible way
- Sharing and providing educational opportunities
- Helping to ensure the safety of our community through outreach and support
- Advocating for professional advancement

- Safety and Outreach, led by Nolan Kagetsu, MD
- Professional Advancement, led by Brijen Shah, MD
